Attacks by left-wing extremists increased by 80 percent in the For example, FALN (an independence group for Puerto Rico), 2000's. All attacks were motivated by environmentalism, conducted 100 in the 70's and just 13 in the 80's. Right-wing focused to cause property damage, and none were lethal. Rightextremist attacks increased slightly from 14% of total attacks and wing extremism declined by 40 percent. 19% of victim deaths in the 70's to 19% of total attacks and 48% of all deaths in the 80's.
